

SCHOOL CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES

Melville School Board has ratified the schedule of contributions and charges for 2024.

Parents can opt to pay the total costs for the year per child per year level (as indicated in the Contributions & Charges form), at the beginning of the school year.

Contributions

The term "contribution" refers to a voluntary sum of money requested from parents to help meet the costs of materials, services and facilities provided in the delivery of the school's educational program. Melville School Board has approved the following contributions:

Kindergarten to Year 6 \$60 per child.

The contribution may be made payable as an inclusion on the personal items list or paid at the school office before the end of term 1. If not paid on the personal items list this amount will be included on the term 1 invoice.

Charges

The term "charges" refers to costs that <u>may be</u> incurred in the extension of the school's educational program. It is expected that all students will attend all incursions and excursions which relate directly to their academic, social and emotional development.

Week 3 of each term, an invoice will be sent home to parents indicating the excursions/incursions their children will be participating in for the term. ANNUAL PARENT CONSENT FORMS - all available on website

Parent consent is requested at the beginning of the year in relation to the following:

School Excursion Health Form - Medical information used for excursions.

Bring your own iPad - Year 5 & 6 students must sign a contract with regards to appropriate use.

Parent and Child Volunteer Declaration Form - Parents are legally required to complete this form if they wish to volunteer on school grounds and or excursions.

Use of Food and Drink in the Classroom - Permission for students to use food in the classroom or receive birthday treats

ATTENDANCE/ABSENCE

If it is necessary for a child to be absent a brief explanation is legally required. Notifications can be given by:

When an explanation is not received, a letter or email will be sent from the school to parents requesting an explanation for a child's absence. CHILDREN ARRIVING LATE OR LEAVING SCHOOL GROUNDS EARLY

Children arriving to school late **MUST** sign in on the Ipad in the front office, they will be given a green card to hand to their teacher in class.

Parents taking students to appointments during the day MUST:

- · visit the front office to sign out the student/s on the IPAD and collect a green card
- · present the green card to your child's teacher as you collect your student/s

Teachers will not release students during lesson times unless the green card is provided.

MOBILE PHONE USAGE

The Department of Education does not permit student use of mobile phones in public schools unless for medical or teacher directed educational purpose. Thus all public schools are required to *ban the use of mobile phones for all students from the time they arrive until the end of the school day, including break times.* Students from Kindergarten to Year 6 are **not permitted** to have mobile phones in their possession during the school day. This includes the use of smart watches. Students messaging each other through these devices will be in contriban of the Digital Technologies agreement.

Request for exemption due to medical or personal reasons must be sought from the principal by completing the 'Request to bring a Communication Device to School' form.

PARENT PARKING

- STAFF PARKING area is for staff and commercial deliveries ONLY.
- Parent carparks are found on McKnight Place and the Kiss 'n' Drop on Curtis Road in front of the Early Community Building.
- City of Melville has also provided parking bays on Curtis Road.

Disabled bays are located in the staff car park, the Kiss 'n' Drop area and the McKnight car park. These bays are clearly marked and are for students or parents who have the ACROD permit clearly displayed on the

dash.

SCHOOL PREMISES

The school oval can be used after hours, bookings for this are managed by the City of Melville.

The tennis courts may be used by members of the public **after 4.30pm** on school days, weekends and school holidays.

It is advised that the community refrain from entering school building areas out of school hours. There is CCTV installed around the school grounds.

CANTEEN

The school canteen is open for lunch orders and morning recess sales *Monday, Wednesday and Friday* from 8.30am. Canteen is staffed by Kylie and volunteer parents helpers.

- Volunteer helpers are always needed. You would be required between 8.45am and 1.00pm. Most parents do one
 or two rosters a term.

NO HAT NO PLAY POLICY

Our policy was established in consultation with the school community and childen will not be able to play in the sun unless they are wearing a school approved hat.

LOST PROPERTY

- Placed in labelled mini wheelie bins in community covered areas. Parents and children may claim items of clothing from these points.
- Year 6 student parliament go through all lost property every second week. Items that are labelled are returned to students. Items that are not labelled will be placed around flagpole during assembly for collection.
- Valuable items eg purses, watches etc are kept at the school office.

DRESS CODE

The School Board has established a dress code for all students attending the school.

ASSEMBLIES

Our school assemblies are celebrations and run every second Friday of term at 8.50am in the under cover area. Each class is timetabled to host the assembly throughout the year. Parents are welcome to attend.

REPORTING TO PARENTS

- Two formal reports via Connect in July and December. Please ensure your email address is kept up to date with school administration.
- The school can provide a paper copy at a cost of \$5 per report, if required.

MANAGEMENT OF STUDENT BEHAVIOUR

- The You Can Do It Values program is taught across the school to build social and emotional development.
- Cyber Bullying Students as young as Year 3 have experienced cyber bullying issues. Please be vigilant with social networking sites

LOST/DAMAGED SCHOOL EQUIPMENT

Parents are asked to replace school equipment that is lost or damaged by their children - reading books, musical instruments, library books etc.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP - STUDENT PARLIAMENT

• Elected members of Cabinet are responsible for carrying out numerous functions around the school in the Sport, Health, Finance, Education, Environment, Citizenship, Technology and Communication Ministries.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

BICYCLES

- Only children from Year 4 6 may ride bicycles to school.
- Children under the age of 10 can ride if accompanied by an adult.
- Bicycles brought to school must be placed in the bicycle racks provided and locked.
- No responsibility is taken by the school for theft or damage.
- · Bicycles are not permitted to be ridden around school buildings including the courts.
- Scooters are also kept at the bike racks. Skate boards or Ripsticks are not to be brought to school.
- Anything on wheels other than prams or wheel chairs are not to be ridden in the school grounds between **8am** and **4pm**. This applies to siblings and parents too.
- · Bicycle helmets are required to be worn by law.

ROAD SAFETY

Children crossing the road at the intersection of Marmion and Rome Road must cross on the pedestrian lights. Children crossing Marmion Road near Curtis Road must cross with the Traffic Warden. Parents are encouraged to adhere to the road signs around the school and to respect the various road rules introduced such as:

Please be vigilant at all times. Parking facing the traffic flow is illegal in WA

DENTAL THERAPY CLINIC

The Attadale Dental Therapy Centre, situated at Attadale Primary School on Wichmann Road, offers free dental service. To become eligible, new enrolments to the school will need to complete an application and consent form to enable the child to receive treatment. FOOD POLICY - see website

The school has many anaphylactic students. Parents are requested to avoid sending any food containing:

- nuts, eggs, peanut paste and Nutella

Please DO NOT provide lollies in lunch boxes as a treat

CELEBRATORY FOOD

- The school has a food and healthy eating policy, adhered to by the canteen.
- Providing birthday food is purely voluntary. Please do not send lollies including chocolates to be given out. Please do not decorate cakes/biscuits with lollies.
- · Celebratory food will be given out at the end of the day.

HAIR CONTROL

In the interest of health and to curtail the possible spread of pediculosis (head lice), hair should be checked regularly and long hair on both girls and boys should be tied back and away from eyes and face of student.

DOGS ON SCHOOL PREMISES

All of the school grounds are **dog-free zones** for health and safety reasons.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION ACTIVITIES

Swimming Carnival

A swimming carnival for year 4 to 6 is held in the first term of the year. Placegetters are selected to represent the school in the interschool swimming carnival.

Cross Country Carnival

Year 4 - 6 participate in the school cross country event. An interschool team is selected from placegetters to compete against other local schools.

Athletics Carnival

Our athletics carnival, consisting of both track and field events for Year PP to 6 students is held in Term 3. The school is also involved in an interschool athletics carnival.

Interschool Carnivals

The school participates in a variety of interschool competitions including Football, Soccer, Netball, Volleyball, Minkey Hockey and Cross Country for students in Year 4 to 6.

Swimming Lessons

Year 5 & 6 students have swimming lesson at the beach during term one. All other students have swimming lessons at Melville Aquatic Centre during the year.

The Arts form an integral part of Melville Primary School and include;
